**Have faith in God (Mark 11:22). Fear not, believe only (Luke 8:50). Draw nigh to God (James 4:8). Trust in the Lord (Psalm 37:3). Rest in the Lord (Psalm 37:7). Wait on the Lord (Psalm 27:14). Glory (boast) in the Lord (2 Cor. 10:17). Exalt ye the Lord (Psalm 99:5). Wait patiently for Him (Psalm 37:7). Be ye also patient (James 5:8). Hope thou in God (Psalm 43:11). O fear the Lord (Psalm 34:9). In everything give thanks (1 Thess. 5:18). Be thankful unto Him (Psalm 33:1). Rejoice in the Lord (Psalm 33:1; Phil. 3:1). Sing unto the Lord (Psalm 96:1). Let him sing psalms (James 5:13). Praise ye the Lord (Psalm 113:1).**

**Let brotherly love continue (Heb. 13:1). Bear one another's burdens (Gal. 6:2). Be careful for nothing (don't worry about anything) —(Phil. 4:6). Quench not the Spirit (1 Thess. 5:19). Lie not one to another (Col. 3:9). Walk in the Spirit (Gal. 5:16). Walk ye in Him (Col. 2:6). Love not the world (1 John 2:15). Keep yourselves from idols (1 John 5:21). Let us walk honestly (Rom. 13:13). Be ye therefor sober (1 Pet. 4:7). Be of one mind (2 Cor. 13:11). Be clothed with humility (1 Pet. 5:5). Be sober, be vigilant (1 Pet. 5:8). Think on these things (Phil. 4:8 and see context). Be of good courage (Psalm 27:14). Be of good comfort (2 Cor. 13:11). Overcome evil with good (Rom. 12:21). Take heed unto thyself (1 Tim. 4:16). Exercise thyself unto godliness (1 Tim. 4:7). Therefore, brethren, stand fast (2 Thess. 2:15).**
