

Remembering Lot's Wife

Genesis 19:17-26

"But his wife looked back from behind him, and she became a pillar of salt" (*Gen.* 19:26). In the day when the Son of Man is revealed, there will be people on their housetops. Jesus instructed them not to get their stuff (possessions) in the house. Those in the fields must not turn back (*Luke 17:30-31*). Then Jesus said. "Remember Lot's wife"

(Luke 17:32). Lot was told to escape for his life and "look not behind thee...lest thou be consumed" (Gen. 19:17).

We are not told the name of Lot's wife. She was married to a righteous man (2 Pet. 2:7-8). She enjoyed living in a luxurious city "well-watered everywhere...even as the garden of the LORD" (Gen. 13:10). She fled with her husband, but her heart was still in Sodom. She left but did not want to leave. Her attachment was to the world, not to the LORD. As she fled, she looked back to the city she desired and was immediately judged and pillarized. She became a statue of salt caught in the act of looking back.

Jesus said to remember her. He warned us not to be like her.

While we can't be totally sure of this, there is testimony that this pillar existed for at least 2000 years. The historian Josephus said, "I have seen it, and it remains at this day." Irenaeus and Clement of Rome record that they too had seen her pillar of salt, indicating it may have been some kind of tourist attraction. Perhaps, even our Lord had visited this monument. Whether or not this is so, Jesus wants us to burn this event into our memory.

Sodom was prosperous, yet it was a cesspool of iniquity. May we "love not the world" (1 John 2:15-17).

May we never regret having to depart from sinful pleasures but rather rejoice that we are delivered!
