

A Special Day Resulting From a Marvelous Act of God

(Psalm 118:21-29)

"The Stone which the builders refused is become the head stone of the corner" (Psalm 118:22). This Messianic passage is quoted five times in the New Testament (Matt.

21:42; Mark 12:10-11; Luke 20:17; Acts 4:11; 1 Pet. 2:4,7). It speaks of a rejected Stone (Jesus Christ) who then becomes the most exalted and preeminent Stone of the building. This transformation from rejection to exaltation is explained by Peter: "Be it known unto you all...that by the Name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom ye crucified, whom God raised from the dead, even by Him doth this man stand here before you whole. This is the stone which was set at nought of you builders, which is become the head of the corner" (Acts 4:10-11).

Both the death and the resurrection of Christ are in view. Christ was the rejected Stone, and His Father, through the resurrection, has made Him the headstone of the corner. The believing heart can only respond in one way: "This is the LORD's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes" (Psalm 118:23). This leads to verse 24: "This is the day which the LORD hath made; we will rejoice and be glad in it."

While we should rejoice in every day the Lord gives us, yet this verse refers to a special day, the day of Christ's resurrection. The resurrection made it possible for the rejected Stone to become the Head of the corner. Every first day of the week (Sunday), we commemorate the resurrection of our Lord which has made possible new life in Christ and a new standing in grace. Each Lord's Day should be a reminder of the marvelous work God has done in raising His Son and exalting Him as Head over a new body and building, His Church (Eph. 1:19-23). *May the Lord's Day never lose its marvel and wonder*.
