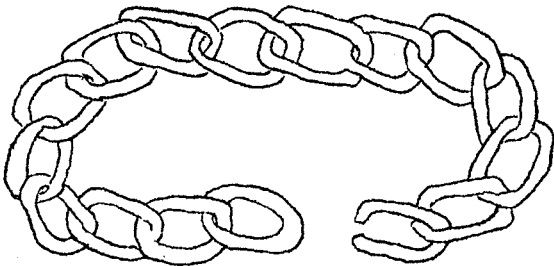


3A. HOW IS A PERSON SAVED?**1B. Not by trying to keep the law.**

The law could never save, it could only show man his need for the Saviour. Think of a mirror. The purpose of a mirror is to show us that we have a dirty face, but we certainly would not use the mirror to wash our face. The mirror should drive us to the soap and water. So God gave the **LAW** that it might drive us to the **LAMB**, the Lord Jesus who taketh away the sins of the world. The law could never give _____ (Galatians 3:21), it could only condemn. As the sinner stands before God's holy and righteous law, all he can say is, "I'M GUILTY!" (Rom. 3:19). God did what the law could never do by the sending of His own _____ (Romans 8:3)! Praise God for the **LAMB**!

2B. Not by good works.

In order to understand **FACT NUMBER 5**, we will study 15 salvation promises that are
 found in the New Testament. These are **conditional promises** which means that ***IF*** the
 sinner does something, ***then*** God promises to do something. In other words, before God will
 fulfill the promise, the sinner must fulfill the condition. As soon as the sinner does what he
 is supposed to do, then God will surely keep His promise. Don't forget that these are
 promises given to us by the God who cannot lie (Titus 1:2).

As we study these 15 salvation promises we want to be looking for two things: a) **First we want to see what the sinner's responsibility is.** This is exactly what the jailer wanted to know in Acts 16:30 when he cried out, "What must I do to be saved?" b) **Second, we want to see what God promises to do for the sinner when the sinner responds in the right way.** The first three verses will be done for you so that you will understand what to look for. Then look up the other verses that are listed and do the same for them.

4A. How Easy Is Salvation?

1B. Being saved is as easy as receiving a gift (John 1:12).

In Ephesians 2:8 we learn that salvation is the _____. If someone were to give you a gift, would you have to pay for it? _____. Therefore, do we need to pay for our salvation? _____. Who did pay for our salvation (read 1 Corinthians 6:20 and 1 Peter 1:18-19)? _____. What is the gift of God according to Romans 6:23? _____

[Note: the word "through" should be translated "in" as in 1 John 5:11]. Salvation is as easy as receiving a gift! We can't work for it! We can't pay for it (compare Acts 8:18-20)! We can't earn it by our own efforts! All we can do is receive it! God's free gift of eternal life is to be found only **in H**_____ **S**_____ (1 John 5:11).

According to 1 John 5:11-12, in order to have God’s gift of eternal life, you must also have God’s _____. Thus, to be saved the sinner must receive a Person! According to John 3:16, what is God’s love-gift to the world? _____ (Note: the words “only begotten” mean **“one of a kind, unique”**--Jesus is God’s unique Son). In John 1:12 we learn that to become sons or children of God we must R_____ the Lord Jesus Christ as our personal Saviour! Although we could never pay God back for the precious gift of His Son, what is one thing that we can say to God in appreciation for what He has done (see 2 Corinthians 9:15)? _____

2B. Being saved is as easy as eating and drinking (John 6:35).

3B. Being saved is as easy as going through a door (John 10:9).

To be saved, a person must enter through what door (John 10:9)? _____ Trusting Christ is no more difficult than going through a door! And yet, as we read Matthew 7:13-14 we discover that only a **F**_____ pass through that door! Remember, there is no other door and no other way (John 14:6; Acts 4:12).

4B. Being saved is as easy as opening a door (Rev. 3:20).

5B. Being saved is as easy as looking (John 3:14-15).

Read Numbers 21:4-9. According to verses 4-5, were the children of Israel trusting the LORD and being thankful to Him or were they complaining over their problems? _____ In verse 6, how did the LORD judge the people for their lack of faith? _____ In verse 8, what did the LORD tell Moses to make? _____ After this was made it was to be lifted up upon a _____. What did the people have to do in order to be cured of their snake bites? _____ In verse 9 we learn that whoever beheld the serpent of bronze _____.

Read John 3:14-15. All those who beheld the bronze serpent lived! All those who look upon the Son of man lifted up on the cross shall also live! When a man truly gazes upon Calvary's cross with the eyes of faith, he will not _____ but will have _____. See also Isaiah 45:21-22. The living God says, "_____ unto _____, and be ye _____." (Note: the word "look" in verse 22 comes from a verb which means "to turn, to face someone" and thus the LORD is saying in Isaiah 45:22, "Face Me, turn your face towards Me").

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Clarification: While God's plan of salvation is in itself simple and clear, a number of "difficulties" arise on man's side which are impossible for him to overcome *of himself*. Sadly, in many cases sinful man does not want help, but is content to wallow in his sins. The stubborn and wicked refusal of men to believe on Christ and receive God's free gift flows from their condition of total depravity—which was true of all of us (compare John 5:40). Hence, there is the necessity for God to do a work in our hearts which only He can do by His Spirit. There are many reasons why it is very difficult for sin-enslaved men to be saved, including the following: 1) It is very difficult for a person to humble himself and acknowledge his utter sinfulness and spiritual bankruptcy (Luke 18:9-14). 2) Proud man believes that he must do something to earn his salvation, and it is very difficult for him to understand that it is all of grace based on what Christ has done (Eph. 2:8-9; Tit. 3:5). 3) Christ taught that it was extremely difficult, yea, impossible, for a rich man to be saved, due to the fact that no one can be saved while trusting anything or anyone other than Christ (Matthew 19:23-26). But what is impossible with men is possible with God (Matt. 19:26). 4) Being saved is difficult because it requires nothing short of a miracle of God. The dead must be given life (Eph. 2:1-7), the blind must be given sight (1 Cor. 2:14; 2 Cor. 4:3-4), and those who are incurably sick must be healed (Jer. 17:9; 1 Pet. 2:24). 5) Being saved is difficult because depraved men love their sins and do not want to change their ways (John 3:18-20). But all of these difficulties can be overcome because the gospel is "the power of God unto salvation to all who believe" (Rom. 1:16). God is able to do a mighty work in the hearts of sin-blinded and depraved men. Has God opened your eyes to the truth of the gospel (see Matt. 16:13-17; Acts 16:14)?
