



Soul Flight

Isaiah 40:21-31

“They shall mount up with wings as eagles” (*Isaiah 40:31*). Our souls long for the freedom of flight: “Oh that I had wings like a dove” (*Psa. 55:6*). Soul flight for the believer comes with the freedom of having one goal: to please the Lord Jesus Christ, following Him closely and abiding in Him no matter the winds and storms about.

“Live with freedom, courage, and hope. . . . When earthly happiness slips away from you, God’s love will give you wings to fly into His bosom, above all your troubles and cares. . . . Abandon yourselves to God” (Fenelon).

Soul flight is entering into a completely new realm, surrendering to God the unattainable goals and unrealistic expectations which keep us in bondage. It is letting go of regrets, guilt, and cares that weigh us down. We must let the Lord Jesus take our burdens and carry them, so we are light enough to fly on those wings of surrender and trust. An unyielded heart will weigh us down so we can’t fly. Soul flight takes effort and decisiveness and practice. The things of earth have a gravitational pull which will always tug us downward, especially as we’re learning to fly.

Flight takes focus. We can’t look back over our shoulders, or down, or around--except to get our bearings. We can clarify our position and relationship to objects and places and people, but our eyes are ever forward and onward and upward. “Forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus” (*Phil. 3:14*).

One can’t have both worlds: we must renounce the “low” world if we are to experience the high world reached by soul flight. “I’m pressing on the upward way....”
