

Ephesians 3:13-21

The God whom we love and serve is **OMNIPOTENT**, having all power. "For the Lord God omnipotent reigneth" (*Rev. 19:6*). God's power is infinite and unlimited. The word "Almighty" occurs fifty-seven times in the Bible, and is never used of anyone but God. He alone possesses all might and power. This truth has rich practical significance for the child of God.

(1) My eternal security rests on the truth of God's omnipotence. I am constantly being kept by the power of God (*1 Pet. 1:5*), and the Almighty is able to keep me from falling and to present me faultless before the presence of His glory (*Jude 24*).

(2) Nothing can prevent or hinder God from completing what He started in my life: "Being confident of this...that He which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ" (*Phil. 1:6*).

(3) I can know "the power of His resurrection" (*Phil. 3:10*), and that very power which He wrought in Christ when He raised Him from the dead is available to me (*Eph. 1:19-20*).

(4) The God of all power works in me both to will and to do of God's good pleasure (*Phil. 2:13*).

(5) Because I have been connected to such an amazing power source, "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me" (*Phil. 4:13*).

(6) "The power of Christ may rest upon me" so that even in my weakness I can be strong (2 Cor. 12:9-10).

(7) I need not fear the power of Satan because I have a greater power dwelling within (*1 John 4:4*).

(8) God has given to me the spirit of power, love and a sound mind (*2 Tim. 1:7*).

(9) The glorious gospel which I share with others is the life-changing "power of God" (*Rom. 1:16; 1 Cor. 1:18*).
